The Grass Needs Help Too

Coyote Warning

The breeding season for coyotes runs each year from January through March. During this time, they become more territorial and aggressive so be safe and watch your dog at all times. Accompany them outside if they need to go to the bathroom, especially at night.



If you encounter a coyote, do not turn your back or run away. Yell loudly in a deep voice, wave your arms, make noise to encourage it to move away from you. Leash your dog and if the coyote does not leave the area, back away slowly while still facing the coyote.

With a bit of caution, it's easy to co-exist. It's up to us to be vigilant and protect our dogs.

It's Time to Get River Park Back in Shape!

Join us for the annual River Park Spring Cleanup in partnership with The City of Calgary on Saturday, April 27 from 9:30 until 12:30pm. Come for part or all of the time. On event day, swing by the south end of the park and stop by the Friends of River Park table to sign the volunteer sheet and be assigned an area to clean.

Although The City uses the acronym P.U.P.P.Y. (Pick up Puppy's Poop Yourself) to promote their park clean-up efforts, the Friends of River Park Off-leash Advocates will use our regular theme because people may think the event is geared toward young dogs only.

This year, we'll also focus on the River Park escarpment, a part of River Park that we rarely address. It's disgusting to see the amount of used poop bags, coffee cups and beer cans littering the east side of River Park along the escarpment from north to south. The amount of discarded items seems much worse than in previous years. We all know they didn't get there by themselves. It's easy to speculate about the reasons why this is happening. We can certainly all agree that in all cases it's uncaring and irresponsible people causing the problem.

Please set aside some time on clean-up day. We can make a difference and right a wrong.

Planning to join the pack? Here's a reminder list for event day:

- Bring gloves & bags or a pail and shovel
- · Wear suitable clothing and footwear
- Dogs are welcome to join owners cleaning River Park but not allowed to join owners cleaning along the escarpment

If you'd like to help clean the escarpment, keep in mind it's pretty steep so you should be reasonably fit to scramble up and down.
